Synopsis: James displays and discusses photographs of Ulysses Grant that he has acquired over the last 45 years, some largely unknown, all of them illuminated by reference to Grant's writings. James reminds us: Grant was the most photographed American living in the 19th century.

1:15-2:10 P.M. **Hon. Roy Blunt**, President of the State Historical Society of Missouri; former United States Senator / **Grant on Reconstruction: "I will keep my word"**

Synopsis: Grant's decade of determination to give meaning to the three reconstruction amendments to the constitution and the actions he took after the war are important parts of our history. As the commanding General of the Army and as President, Grant worked to advance civil and military quality and to eliminate the Ku Klux Klan.

Synopsis: Mark and Amanda, Director of Soldiers Memorial and Public Historian for the Missouri Historical Society, respectively, team up to present a fascinating study of intersection in the lives of two of St. Louis's most famous men.
